

Conducting a Voter Registration Drive in Arizona

Voter Registration Deadline

29 days before Election Day

Getting Started

Training Requirement: Arizona does not require training for registration drives.

Notification and Registration Requirements: Arizona does require notification of a registration drive.

Compensation Restrictions: Do not pay registration drive participants based on how many registrations they collect.

Obtaining Applications

Online Registration: Individuals with an Arizona driver license or ID card may register online using [EZ Voter Registration](#).

State Form:

- Available on the [Secretary of State's website](#).
- Request an Arizona voter registration form from the [county recorder](#) in the county in which the applicant is a legal resident.

Federal Form: The [federal mail-in registration application](#) may also be used in voter registration drives.

Photocopying Blank Forms: You may photocopy blank forms for use in voter registration drives.

Handling Applications

Incomplete Applications: No changes should be made or information added to a completed, signed registration application.

Photocopying Completed Applications: Arizona law does not expressly prohibit photocopying completed registration applications.

Proof of Citizenship: Arizona requires proof of citizenship for registration. If you provide the number listed on an Arizona driver's license or state ID issued after October 1, 1996 on the state or federal registration form, you don't need to provide anything more.

If you don't have an Arizona driver's license or state ID issued after October 1, 1996, then what you do depends on whether you are using the state or the federal registration form.

State form: In addition to the last 4 digits of your Social Security Number, you must provide a copy of one form of proof of citizenship which can be any of the following:

- A photocopy of a U.S. birth certificate and supporting legal documentation (i.e. marriage certificate) if your name has changed;
- A photocopy of the front pages of your passport;
- U.S. naturalization documents or your Alien Registration Number;
- Your Indian Census Number, Bureau of Indian Affairs Card Number, Tribal Treaty Card Number, or Tribal Enrollment Number; or
- A photocopy of your Tribal Certificate of Indian Blood or Tribal or Bureau of Indian Affairs Affidavit of Birth.

Federal form: The law allows you to register for federal elections only if you provide only the last four digits of your Social Security Number, but do not provide any proof of citizenship. If you provide both your SSN and proof of citizenship from the above list, then you can register to vote in all elections.
