Conducting a Voter Registration Drive in Illinois

Voter Registration Deadlines

- Applications must be received or postmarked by the 28th day before Election Day.
- Election Day registration is available 15 days prior to Election Day at the local election authority's office), registration is available on Election Day at designated permanent polling places in each county.

Getting Started

Anyone can distribute and collect voter registration applications. Completed applications must be mailed or delivered to the local election authority, and an applicant is considered registered as soon as they receive a voter ID card in the mail. Therefore, the drive should be planned far enough in advance that the forms can be mailed and received by the deadline.

Becoming a deputy registrar: Deputy registrars must be trained, take an oath, and be provided the voter registration materials by their own election authority. Deputy registrars may register anyone that lives in Illinois, except for a Healthcare and Family Services director or designated employees, and an Employment Security director or designated employees, who are restricted to the county.

To become a deputy registrar, a person must be:

- at least 18 years old,
- a U.S. citizen,
- a resident of Illinois, and
- registered to vote in the county in which they are appointed or, if appointed by a board of election commissioners, registered to vote within that election jurisdiction.

Training: Only deputy registrars must be trained by the election authority.

Compensation Restrictions: Do not pay registration drive participants based on how many registrations they collect.

Obtaining Applications

State Form: The <u>state voter registration application</u> can be downloaded from the Illinois State Board of Elections website.

Federal Form: Volunteers may use the <u>federal mail-in</u> <u>registration application</u>.

Photocopying Blank Forms: Blank applications may be photocopied and used in voter registration drives.

Handling Applications

Volunteers Not Authorized as Deputy Registrars:

Volunteers may distribute and collect voter registration application forms; however, the election authority must receive these forms by the registration deadline.

Deputy Registrars: Registrars will complete the registration forms and return them to their own election authority. If the person registering is from another jurisdiction, the election authority will forward it to the correct jurisdiction.

Assisting Applicants and Completing Forms: Deputy registrars may assist applicants in filling out the registration form and must witness the applicant personally sign the form.

Photocopying Completed Applications: There is no law or rule prohibiting photocopying or retaining information from completed registration applications. A voter's date of birth, signature, full or partial Social Security Number, and driver's license number should be removed before copying any application.

Submitting Applications: Deputy registrars must deliver completed registration forms to the appointing election authority by first-class mail within 2 business days of completion or in person within 7 days of completion. However, forms completed 29-35 days prior to the election must be returned within 48 hours, and forms completed on the 28th day prior to the election must be returned within 24 hours.
