

Conducting a Voter Registration Drive in Utah

Voter Registration Deadlines

Applications that are mailed must be postmarked 30 days before Election Day
In-person and online registration deadline is 7 days before Election Day

Getting Started

Training Requirement: Utah does not require training for registration drives.

Notification and Registration Requirements: Utah does not have notification requirements for registration drives.

Compensation Restrictions: Do not pay registration drive participants based on how many registrations they collect.

Obtaining Applications

State Form: The state voter registration application can be downloaded at the [State of Utah elections website](#). Organizations may also request forms from the county clerk in lots of 250, replaceable when each lot of 200 is returned.

Federal Form: The [federal mail-in voter registration application](#) may be used in voter registration drives.

Photocopying Blank Forms: Blank applications may be photocopied and used in voter registration drives.

Handling Applications

Incomplete Applications: Do not fill in any missing information on a registration form unless you have permission from the applicant.

Photocopying Completed Applications: There is no law or rule prohibiting photocopying or retaining information from completed registration applications. **A voter's date of birth, signature, full or partial Social Security Number, and driver's license number should be removed before copying any application.**

Submitting Completed Applications: Applications submitted by third-party voter registration organizations must be received by the [appropriate county clerk](#) or postmarked 30 days before Election Day.
